The Deputy Clerk reported the following:

- SSDC had given Somerset Farmer's Market permission to use the area in front of the Town Hall for their next market on Saturday 16 January.
- A resident had contacted the Town Council regarding gullies in the town that were not emptying correctly despite County Highways confirming they had been cleared. There were further gullies which were blocked. Cllr. Best asked if Highways could supply a map for gully emptying along with a contractor's report of which gullies had been cleared. Councillors requested that the subject of gullies was brought to a future Planning and Highways agenda.

Cllr. Roundell Greene asked if there was any news regarding the upgrade of the Maiden Beech crossroads now that the planning application for houses at the top of Kithill had been approved. Cllr Best reminded Councillors that he had submitted a Small Improvement Scheme (SIS) to move the speed limit of 30mph to beyond the junction. He had, however, asked for this SIS to be held in abeyance until he could meet with the SIS team as he wanted to amend the SIS request to include an upgrade of the junction.

Cllr. Head reported that she had received correspondence from a resident who had been in contact with SSDC regarding a request for more dog bins. According to the resident the SSDC officer had visited Crewkerne and had agreed that four more bins were required, but had pointed out that SSDC staff were only able to empty an additional two bins. As a result, a request had been directed to the parish council for two additional bins. Councillors agreed that the problem of dog fouling had become worse recently and it was therefore agreed that this would be brought back to a future meeting as an agenda item for consideration.

Cllr. Roberts asked whether the Council's CCTV cameras could be used to identify the offending owners who continually allowed their dogs to foul the pavements. In response, Cllr. Best pointed out that this would be a potentially very time-consuming exercise and also that the cameras were not set up for close-up views, so identification could be problematic. The Chairman pointed out that, as the CCTV cameras were used by the police, it was necessary to ensure that details of CCTV coverage remained secure. Nevertheless, he requested that Cllr. Best brief his fellow Councillors on CCTV coverage in a confidential meeting of the Council.
