37 **REFURBISHMENT OF THE PUBLIC TOILETS**

21/22 To further consider the options for refurbishment of the Falkland Square public toilets

It was noted that a very small number of residents had written to the Council, expressing concerns about the planned replacement of the current ladies and gents public toilets with unisex pod-style toilets. Councillors noted these comments, but reiterated that the Council had discussed the matter in detail prior to making a decision. The key points of note were that gender neutral toilets provided a more inclusive solution, and this style of public toilet was now commonplace throughout the country. It was also noted that the building had the capacity to have additional pods installed, should this prove necessary.

On this basis, it was agreed that the Council should continue to move forward with the current plan to refurbish the Falkland Square public toilets.
