Planning & Highways Committee

The Planning and Highways Committee meetings continue to take place on the second Monday of each month. We always hold a public open forum at the meeting where personal representations are welcomed. The Town Council is only able to make observations and recommendations on planning applications which are taken into account when they are considered by the Unitary Authority, Somerset Council. Somerset Council takes all the decisions on the applications. The Planning & Highways Committee has considered 53 Chair, P& H Committee applications this year to date. We continue to meet regularly with Somerset Council Highways Officers about issues in the town.

Amenities Committee

We have had another busy year to report from the Amenities team at Crewkerne Town Council. The Lodge was refurbished and brought back into use in April as a base for our operations and grounds team. There is still some repointing work to do to the outside to ensure it survives for many years to come. The initial project scope was brought in under budget, and the remaining funds have been earmarked to pay for this work. Severalls tennis courts were both fully refurbished and are now open to the public - it is good to see so many people booking and playing, especially as the weather improves.

We were fortunate to obtain funding from the War Memorials Trust which has enabled us to carry out repointing works to the historic Severalls pillars and further funding helped with a professional cleaning, pointing and lettering of the 'Tommy' war memorial by a heritage stone mason.

October saw the first Bincombe Day since the pandemic, and we welcomed the Lord Lieutenant and many local families who enjoyed chainsaw sculptures, made charcoal and took part in woodland story telling. The new sculptures were added to the nature trail, for which we have been awarded funding to update the welcome boards and trail leaflets.

A public meeting regarding the George Reynolds Centre was well attended, and from this volunteers from sports clubs, preschool and community came forward to form a company to take on the management of the Centre going forward. This will be a complex process but regular updates will be given at Council meetings.

Finally, our weekly Wednesday market has made a welcome return to Market Square. It is operating on a trial basis, so please support it where you can. So far, we have enjoyed artisan cheese, bakery goods, preserves, wooden crafts, meats, vegan quiches and treats, fruit and veg, and hope to welcome more traders in the future.

Policy & Resources Committee

The Policy & Resources Committee has continued to refresh all policies and procedures in accordance with the policy review schedule drawn up and implemented last year. Out of 45 policy documents, only 5 are now outstanding for review. This formed a key part in our submission to the Local Council Award Scheme, which resulted in CTC being awarded Quality Status; the only council in Somerset to hold this award.

The next key piece of work will be to implement the new model Financial Regulations which have recently been published.

Finance Report

Crewkerne and West Crewkerne Joint Burial Committee (JBC)

West Crewkerne Parish Council and Crewkerne Town Council jointly own the cemetery. This dates back to 1893 when West Crewkerne joined Crewkerne in a Joint Burial Board. So, the cemetery is managed jointly by the JBC for the benefit of residents in both parishes.

The Committee meets five times each year and is responsible for overseeing the grounds maintenance, memorials and burials. This year we have had the cemetery gates refurbished, which has improved the approach to the cemetery. We are about to open two new sections; one for full burials, one for ashes and pathways to help with access are being laid. We had a very successful and well-attended open day in September, with a talk about 'Life and Death in Crewkerne' from Tracey Warren of Stoodley & Sons.

During the past year there have been 34 interments, which includes both full burials and ashes burials. 18 grave plots have been purchased.


