<u>Crewkerne Town Council's 2025/26 Budget: Community Improvements & Increased Grant Support</u>

Crewkerne Town Council has agreed a 1.8% increase in the 2025/26 precept, adding £4.46 per year to a Band D property (£0.37 per month). This small adjustment will fund key projects and services:

- **Community Spaces:** Upgrading Happy Valley floodlights to energy-efficient LEDs ensuring our parks and recreational areas are well-lit and safe for all.
- Local Initiatives: Increased community grants to support local groups.
- **Youth Services:** Funding for Youth Services and a 2025 Skate Jam event. These initiatives aim to engage and support our younger residents.
- **Waste Management:** With changes to Somerset Council's waste removal arrangements, the Town Council will now cover the cost of disposing of waste collected from our open spaces.
- **Health and Safety Upgrades:** Various health and safety inspections are due, and the budget includes funds for necessary rectifications.
- **Public Amenities:** The proposal to increase the cleaning frequency of Falkland Square toilets to twice daily reflects the Council's dedication to maintaining high standards of hygiene.
- **Safety Upgrades:** The addition of a new Speed Indicator Device is part of the Council's ongoing efforts to improve road safety and promote awareness of speeding within the town.

Mayor of Crewkerne, Alice Samuel, commented:

"As we look ahead to the new financial year, this modest increase in the precept will enable Crewkerne Town Council to continue delivering essential services, support local initiatives, and invest in the future of our town. Together, we can build a brighter, more vibrant community for all".




Defibrillators & Bleed Kits



We are pleased to announce the launch of a new resource for our community: a comprehensive map showing the locations of all thirteen defibrillators across the town. These vital devices can save lives in the critical moments following a cardiac arrest. The full map is on the Discover Crewkerne website or a hard copy is available from the Local Information Centre. In addition to this, we're proud to share that three new bleed kits have recently been installed at the Crewkerne Dental Centre, George Reynolds Centre and Central Convenience Stores. These kits are equipped with essential supplies to help manage severe bleeding injuries until professional medical help arrives. They are designed to be easy to use, with clear instructions, and can make a crucial difference in saving lives in emergencies involving heavy blood loss.

We encourage all residents to familiarise themselves with the locations of these lifesaving tools and to share this information with friends and neighbours. In an emergency, every second counts – together, we can be better prepared to respond and potentially save lives.

TREE PLANTING



Crewkerne Town Council have successfully secured a grant from Somerset Council's Urban Tree Challenge Fund and will see 15 mature trees being planted at Barn Street. The grant will also cover the costs of the maintenance and care of the trees for the next three years. The planned plantings are designed to complement and enhance the existing and future use of green spaces, ensuring they provide shade and urban cooling for future generations. These trees fulfil part of the long term plan for Barn Street which was developed through consultation in 2022.

CREWKERNE BANKING HUB





Crewkerne's new banking hub is opening in April. Banking hubs are delivered by Cash Access UK, a not-for-profit company funded by major banks. They provide shared services in communities where they are needed most. On 26th March Debbie Crow from Cash Access UK will be there to talk about the services available in the hub. She'll answer any questions you may have and explain how the new service will bring access to cash and basic banking back to Crewkerne's town centre.

Customers of all major banks can visit the hub to carry out regular cash transactions at the counter, Monday to Friday, between 9am and 5pm. The counter is operated by the Post Office. Whoever you bank with, this offers face-to-face services such as paying in cash and cheques, making withdrawals, balance enquiries, paying utility bills, and topping up gas and electricity accounts. A community banker will also be available in the hub one day a week on a rota and you won't need to make an appointment to speak to them.

HAVE YOUR SAY!

The Council is seeking your input on an important decision regarding the sandpit at Happy Valley. While it has been a popular feature for children over the years, we've received concerns about its cleanliness due to fouling by dogs and other animals.

To address the issue, the Council is considering two potential solutions:

1 Fencing off the sandpit: This would protect the area and ensure it remains safe for play. However, the cost of installing a fence would be significant.

2 This option would remove the sand entirely, replacing it with a safety surface to create a cleaner, more flexible space for the community to enjoy, with the possible addition of another piece of play equipment.


ROOM HIRE
